



St Luke's School CCTV Policy 2025

As a Rights Respecting School our philosophy is underpinned by the values and principles of the United Nation's Convention on the Rights of the Child (UNCRC).

Article 16: Right to Privacy – This article emphasizes that children have the right to privacy. Your CCTV policy should ensure that the use of CCTV respects this right and outlines how the school will protect students' privacy.

Article 3: Best Interests of the Child – This article states that the best interests of the child must be a primary consideration in all actions concerning children. Your policy should consider how CCTV use serves the best interests of the pupils.

Article 12: Respect for the Views of the Child – Children have the right to express their views in matters affecting them. You might consider including a section in your policy on how the school gathers and considers pupils' views on the use of CCTV.

Article 19: Protection from Violence, Abuse, and Neglect – CCTV can be a tool for protecting children from harm, aligning with the school's duty to safeguard pupils.

St Luke's School uses closed circuit television (CCTV) images for the purposes of crime reduction and safeguarding.

The system comprises 9 fixed cameras all on the exterior of the building. The system does not have sound recording capability.

The CCTV system is owned and operated by the school, the deployment of which is determined by the school's leadership team.

The CCTV is locally hosted and does not save data on any other server or cloud-based systems.

The introduction of, or changes to, CCTV monitoring will be subject to consultation with Jersey Property Holdings, staff and the school community.

The school's CCTV system is registered with the Information Commissioner. The use of CCTV, and the associated images is covered by the Data Protection Law (Jersey) 2018. This policy outlines the school's use of CCTV and how it complies with the legislation.

All authorised operators and employees with access to images are aware of the procedures that need to be followed when accessing the recorded images and sound. All operators are trained about their responsibilities under the CCTV policy. All employees are aware of the restrictions in relation to access to, and disclosure of recorded images.

CCTV warning signs are provided by Jersey Property Holdings and should be clearly and prominently placed at all external entrances to the school. In areas where CCTV is used, the Jersey Property Holdings will ensure that there are prominent signs placed at both the entrance of the CCTV zone and within the controlled area.



The planning and design has endeavoured to ensure that the system will give maximum effectiveness and efficiency, but it is not possible to guarantee that the system will cover or detect every single incident taking place in the areas of coverage.

Siting the Cameras

Cameras will be sited so they only capture images relevant to the purposes for which they are installed, (as described above), and care will be taken to ensure that reasonable privacy expectations are not violated.

CCTV is not located in the internal parts of the building

Storage and Retention of CCTV Images

The school retains CCTV images for 6 weeks.

The school stores CCTV images on the hard drive of the CCTV system.

Access to CCTV Images

Access to recorded images will be restricted to those staff authorised to view them and will not be made more widely available.

Access to and Disclosure of Images to Third Parties

There will be no disclosure of recorded data to third parties other than in crime prevention e.g. States of Jersey Police. Correct procedures will be followed in these circumstances.

Complaints

Complaints will be dealt with in accordance with the school's Complaints Procedure.
